Renee, Derby, KS, was diagnosed with tongue cancer in February 2022. As a single mom, she hoped to receive gas station gift cards to help pay for her long trip from rural Kansas for treatment. Prior to begining her radiation therapies, Renee needed extensive (and expensive!) dental care. Thanks to the partnership between HNC Living Foundation and Delta Dental of Kansas, she was relieved to know the costs of her dental care would be covered. Even with impeccable dental care just prior to her treatment, Renee still experienced tooth loss and gum damage—common side effects from radiation.

In October 2022, she was thrilled to learn she qualified for another grant to help with a denture to help her get back to living life fully. "The last year has been very challenging and this assistance has been a blessing. My dentures have made a huge difference in my confidence and I am so grateful to be able to smile again."



I thought it would be a good way for me to better understand some of the things our head and neck cancer patients experience." The average head and neck cancer patient who receives radiation will have over 40 daily appointments where the mask holds their head, neck and shoulders perfectly still to administer treatment with the utmost precision.
